End of Year**

From the Dean of Students' Office:

Something is missing here at St. Thomas More School right now- the students. They make this school and community complete. It will be business as usual around the campus during the summer, even though the students are not here. “The Chancellor’s Hammer” – Color War 2009, and Beyond:

The White Team, led by Mr. Matt Quinn, won the inaugural Chancellor Hammer competition. After a closely fought Field Day competition, the White Team finished high enough in the Apache Relay Race to pull out a narrow victory. More important than the victory is the charity that the community demonstrated. Over \$2,200 was raised in three months for Pennies for Peace. This money will be used to build schools in impoverished areas of Afghanistan and Pakistan. We look forward to Chancellor Hammer 2010, when the White Team will defend its title.

Wireless Network @ STM:

Access for Everyone, a new initiative to expand the school’s technological resources and capabilities was launched in early May. Phase 1 calls for a wireless network in all dormitory and classroom buildings. Guided by a steering committee comprised of students, faculty members and the administration (Mr. Viands, Mrs. Howard, Mr. Tar, Mr. Hastings, Mr. Schlageter, Mr. Ladd, Joe Cardarelli, Sijabuliso Dube, Yen-Ting Lu, and Chen Xiao Yao), *Access for Everyone* is beginning to take shape. Some general details of the *Access for Everyone* initiative are:

- Access to the wireless network will include accessibility to the internet and each student’s network folder.
- Students will be required to sign into the network, similar to signing into the library computers.
- Access to the network and internet will be unavailable to students during study hall and lights out.
- An internet filter will sift and control content and websites that are deemed unacceptable.

We are excited about the doors this initiative will open up; it will allow the school to execute its educational program in a more efficient and effective manner. Over the summer we will be finalizing a campaign to raise funds for this initiative. Our goal is to have this initiative fully-funded by the middle of next year. Inquiries can be made to Mr. Tim Viands, Dean of Students, who is chairing the steering committee.

Faculty vs. Student Softball Game:

The faculty outlasted the students 9-5 in the annual softball game. This nine-inning marathon was close much of the time, although the faculty team never relinquished control. I know my son agrees with that quote and I would imagine most of your sons do as well. Summer is that time to rejuvenate and put the year's accomplishments into perspective. To be sure, your young men have accomplished a great deal. They have worked hard, learned self discipline, and in many cases have pushed themselves beyond their perceived capabilities. In short, they have grown and their growth has been infectious. As faculty begin thinking of next year there is excitement about working with our young men to make next year even better than this year.

One of the things that generate excitement is the selection of courses for next year. Schedules should be complete and mailed to you during the summer. Enclosed please find copies of your son's final report card and comments for the 2008 – 2009 school year. We are also very happy to announce that over 55 of our underclassmen earned Honor Roll status. Eight students earned Dean's List. Students earn a place on the Dean's List by having all grades above ninety percent (90%). Nineteen underclassmen earned High Honors by having an average grade at ninety percent (90%) or above. Twenty-four young men earned Honors. These students have an average grade above eighty-five percent (85%) but below ninety percent 90%. Probably one our most important achievements is the Effort Honor Roll. Four students earned a place on the Effort Honor Roll by having all effort grades of “B” or better. Considering the 4th quarter is the time when many students suffer academically due to all the distractions of spring and the expectations of going home for

the summer, our young men stayed focused and finished strong. I am proud of them all. I hope you enjoy your summer with your sons as much as we enjoyed this past year with them. As always, do not hesitate to contact the school with any questions or concerns.

At a time of year when focus is easily lost, we were impressed to see the students engaged in meaningful studying. We will implement this same concept for mid-term and final exams next year.

College Placement Updates:

Many parents ask “what can my son do over the summer to get a head start on the college placement process.” Ask any of our college counselors and they will say that there is a lot of tasks that can be completed. Among them are:

- Visit a few colleges with your son. Have him get a feel for what he is looking for. Sometimes the best thing about visiting a college is that your son realizes that he doesn't like it.
- Have your son begin his college essay. He could also start working on a resume for colleges.
- Community service is looked highly upon by colleges. Have your son clock some service hours over the break. Don't forget to get a letter of verification for every job worked.
- Have your son begin exploring NAVIANCE, the school's web-based college placement platform. Contact Mark Allen for more information about how to log on.
- Paying for college is an increasingly painful task. The sooner you begin identifying scholarship opportunities the better. There are thousands of unused scholarships every year and something out there for everyone.
- It is also recommended that rising seniors do a little prep-work for the SAT's they will be taking in the fall.

The school has updated the Travel Permission choices for next year. There will only be two choices, instead of three, next year. They are:

- "Most Restrictive"- Parents must call, email or fax the school by Thursday to grant permission for their son to go home.
- "Least Restrictive"- Parents grant their son permission to travel home on the weekends, unless there is a phone call, email or fax saying otherwise.

- All international students will be required to have the “Most Restrictive” permission.

Track & Field (Coaches Drew Riggs, Tom Bushnell and Mark Allen):

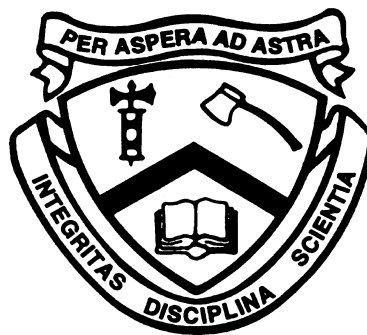
